

## Tips for Successful Applications

At the heart of every successful new project is the **why**. How does your initiative stand out? How will this affect your community? (Think SMART : specific, measurable, achievable, realistic, time-bound. What legacy will this new equipment leave for your community?)

**What** is your group planning? Describe your project in as much detail as you can. What steps are needed to get there?

What has your group already done? **Who** is involved? Do you have any letters of support from your municipality or school?

**Keep it simple!** Keep your writing brief and use simple language. (Think: use rather than utilize; try rather than endeavor.)

## Available Grants

### Deadline: Nov. 30

One of the goals of the **Jeux Canada Games** is to leave a heritage of physical and human resources in both the host community and the province. The 1989 Jeux Canada Games left Saskatoon and Saskatchewan with legacies in facilities, community development and sport. Sport equipment from the Games was distributed to communities and organizations throughout the province for use by amateur athletes.

#### Deadline: Feb. 18, 2020

The Sport Projects Grant provides project funding to sports organizations based in Saskatoon for equipment purchases (sports or office), facility upgrades, governance reviews, strategic planning, feasibility studies, website development, or market research aimed at refocusing development.
